

Council election and referendum

The Central Coast Council election was held on 14 September 2024 and 15 councillors were elected, with three councillors representing each of the five wards.

On the same day, a referendum was held, with the community approving the reduction of the number of wards from five to three, with each ward electing three Councillors in the next election term in 2028. The next stage in this process will involve extensive community consultation to determine the new ward boundaries.

The newest attraction on the Coast is popular from dawn to dusk

In August, we completed the final stages of the \$9.85million upgrade at Umina's Peninsula Recreation and Active Lifestyle Precinct, which is already busy every day with locals and visitors.

The multi-year project delivered exciting new sports and recreation facilities for all ages and abilities and improved accessibility.

- Regional level skatepark for use by a broad range
 of wheeled sports and different riding abilities from
 beginner to advanced. The park is now suitable to
 host competitions and includes a unique advanced
 deep bowl and mini beginner bowl plus street
 elements. Works also included the installation
 of park furniture, shelters, water refill station,
 connective pathways and landscaping.
- **Upgraded BMX track** with high-quality asphalt finish surface that is suitable for range of abilities.
- Full-size basketball court with flood lights have been installed on a timer to allow extended use of the new facilities year round.
- Bouldering climbing units, one to accommodate a large number of older children and second smaller climbing structure suitable for younger children.
- Two new sportsground amenities buildings
 (Etta Road and Melbourne Ave), with significantly
 improved features and accessible features.
- Cricket practice nets.

- Umina Tennis facilities upgrade with futsal court installed.
- Construction of shared and connective concrete pathways.
- Reconstruction of Sydney Ave access road with underground drainage, upgraded carpark and new accessible car spaces, pedestrian crossings and pathways.

This project has been funded by the Australian Government with \$8.25million from the Community Development Grants Programme and \$1.55million from Council, with a \$50,000 contribution from Umina Community Group.

More sports upgrades underway across the Coast

New sports amenities buildings are currently under construction at Buff Point Oval and Halekulani Oval, and planning is underway for Frost Reserve Oval building and skate park upgrade. In addition, drainage and irrigation infrastructure upgrades are occurring at Buff Point, Patrick Croke, Harry Moore and Koala Park sportsgrounds, which will improve field conditions, safety and increase playability all year round.

Beach access projects

Two beach access projects on the Central Coast are complete, thanks to \$2.44million from Federal and State government grants and Council contributions. The Jenny Dixon Beach stairs got a muchneeded repair, while the stairs at Soldiers Beach Surf Life Saving Club received an extension.

Roads and transport

Road works continue across our 2,000km network

We know roads are important to our community and we continue to invest in road maintenance and improvements.

Maintenance works such as pothole filling continue to be undertaken weekly, with over 43,300 potholes filled since the start of the year.

A regular schedule of longer-term solutions, such as heavy patching (section repairs) and road renewals (whole road rehabilitation) are also being delivered across the region. Some recent works include:

- Road pavement upgrade works at Berkeley Vale (Lakedge Ave), MacMasters Beach (The Scenic Rd), East Gosford (Althorp St) and Somersby (Debenham Rd South).
- Road resurfacing works at East Gosford (Russell St), Ettalong Beach (Schnapper Rd), Killcare Heights (Maitland Bay Dr, Stewart St), MacMasters Beach (Namatjira Rd) and Woongarrah (Hiawatha Rd).

We also continue to undertake the extensive repair and remediation works to our road network impacted by natural disasters. There are 103 sites with disaster impacts which are all pinpointed on our interactive online map, so you can easily keep up to date with the current project status. Improving bus stop access

We continue improving accessibility for public transport users through our Bus Stop Improvement Program, with many of the 43 locations already completed and more to come. Works include a concrete boarding pad, tactile markers and a link to an existing footpath or installation of a pedestrian ramp. These works ensure that each stop meets Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) requirements, and that all residents and visitors in these areas can access public transport and travel throughout the region.

Water Treatment upgrade on schedule

Our most recent planned shutdown of the Mardi Water Treatment Plan is complete. This has resulted in improved safety of drinking water, durability of existing structures and flexibility and efficiency of operations. This \$82.5million project is being delivered by Council in partnership with the NSW Government's Restart Safe and Secure Water Program, which has contributed \$6.85million.

Coastal Management Programs (CMPs) guide the way that Council manages our beaches, rivers, lagoons, estuaries and catchments. We are working on five CMPs that will provide a 10-year action plan for the management of our waterways. Each plan identifies the coastal management issues and opportunities, identifies actions to address those issues, in an integrated and strategic manner, how they are to be implemented and who is responsible.

A new learning space is rising at Gosford

The Gosford Regional Library is rapidly taking shape, with the four-level lift shaft shell in place, level 1 and 2 slabs poured and columns and structural walls in place! The completion of the Regional Library is slated for mid-2025. Interestingly, the ground floor slab is poured last - after the rest of the structure is complete – to prevent damage before the surface is polished.
