Cycle, walk and roll on the new Magenta shared pathway

The newly constructed 3.7km section of the Magenta shared pathway opened just in time for Christmas so residents and visitors could enjoy a safe and scenic experience over the holidays! This project has completed a continuous section of shared path from The Entrance to Toukley, with a viewing platform, two suspended boardwalks and rest areas with seating tables and bike racks. Plants propagated from the site are being replanted in areas adjacent to the new pathway.

The 40km/hr school zones are back in force from Friday 31 January! Please slow down when you're around schools in our local area. Safe battery disposal

As the festive season ends, please remember the importance of properly disposing of unwanted items, especially batteries. Last year, there were 10 fires in waste collection vehicles and our recycling team had 12 close calls with batteries exploding and causing fires. Nationally there were around 12,000 fires caused by batteries. Remember to recycle batteries properly at Council waste facilities at Woy Woy and Buttonderry or take them to a B-Cycle drop off point.

Securing our future water supply

As the Coast grows, we are committed to futureproofing our water supplies. The Mardi Water Treatment Plant upgrade is the largest and most ambitious water infrastructure project our region has seen this decade. With the third shutdown successfully completed, we are one step closer to a secure water future. Two more shutdowns are planned for 2025 as part of the \$82.5million upgrade, supported by \$6.85million from NSW's Restart Safe and Secure Water Fund, benefiting over 210,000 residents.

We have continued to deliver our bush fire mitigation program of works, including the maintenance of fire trails and use of the newly introduced remote control mower to maintain fire breaks in difficult terrain.
