Mayor's Message

We're wrapping up a financial year that saw the return of elected representatives and a new term of democratic decision-making. We're listening and your voice is being heard.

One of the most important things we've done is to adopt new strategic plans that will shape our future. We did this in consultation with our community and I thank everyone who provided feedback.

It's been gratifying to produce a Councillor-led Delivery Program and we've highlighted our priorities:

- allocated an additional \$20 million over three years to road renewals, plus \$800,000 for potholes.
- improving accessibility in sport and recreation facilities, beaches and play spaces.
- implementing the Airport Masterplan and developing a Warnervale Business Precinct Masterplan.
- addressing affordable housing and removing planning impediments relating to homelessness.
- upgrading footpaths and shared pathways.
- delivering our Youth Strategy actions.
- finalising our Coastal Management Programs and work to improve waterways.

We're also looking forward to the grand opening of the Gosford Regional Library – a game changer for our community.

Lake Munmorah Recreation Facility coming soon!



We're building an active recreation precinct for the north of the Coast! The new facility in Doyalson North will include a regional playspace, district skatepark and pump track, improved access road and car park, plus BBQs, water stations and more. A year in review

Here are some of the major projects we've delivered in the 24-25 financial year

Our Little Terns broke a record!

The annual Little Tern breeding season at Karagi Point saw 228 fledglings - the most ever recorded on the NSW coast further supporting the survival of the endangered species.



We completed the \$9.85 million upgrade of the Peninsula Recreation and Active Lifestyle Precinct at Umina Beach, delivering new sports and recreation facilities including a regional skate park and pump track, and improved accessibility.

Over 70,000 potholes filled

Pothole repairs are a short-term measure to ensure the road remains safe and fit for purpose, until more permanent repairs are undertaken.



Welcomed back **Councillors**

Following a referendum and local government elections in September 2024, 15 Central Coast Councillors, representing 5 wards, were reinstated. They have since been representing you, the community, on a wide range of issues and topics.

Central Coast celebrated for sustainable tourism

Central Coast continues to lead in sustainable tourism. Advancing our level of **ECO Destination Certification** and gaining global recognition at the **Green Destinations Story** Awards, placing second for our Little Terns Breeding Program and Pelican Time experience.

Magenta **Shared Pathway** completion

Completed in December 2024, the 3.7km new pathway offers a safe and scenic route from The Entrance North towards Toukley, perfect for cyclists and pedestrians of all ages and abilities.

The works included the repair or replacement of four access points to the popular beaches, following significant storm damage in recent years - restoring public amenity now and for future generations.


Central Coast roads and pathways

Our 10-Year Road Renewal Program and new interactive map

To improve road conditions and tackle infrastructure backlogs, we're investing an extra \$20 million over the next four years into road renewals. This boost will fast-track renewals across 23 priority locations - areas you told us matter most.

This brings our total investment in the 10-Year Road Renewal Program to over \$400 million, reinforcing our commitment to delivering safer, more sustainable roads for the future.

Road renewals restore roads in poor condition or extend their lifespan – improving pavement quality and reducing ongoing maintenance costs. The program includes a range of treatments, from cost-effective resurfacing to full road rehabilitation and reconstruction.





To make this process more transparent, we've launched a **new interactive map** showing scheduled road renewal works for each year of the program for the next 10 years. This tool allows residents to explore when and where road renewals are planned in their neighbourhood for the first time. Each year programs are reviewed and updated where warranted.

Building a more connected Coast

In 2024-25, we delivered 4.6 kilometres of new shared pathways, expanding the network to over 250 kilometres. Recent additions included Magenta Shores and The Esplanade, Ettalong Beach. We're now focused on adding new shared pathways in Avoca Beach, Tuggerawong and Mannering Park.

We're also reviewing the Central Coast Bike Plan and the Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan (PAMP), with the goal of combining them into a unified Walking and Cycling Strategy. Community input is essential – especially on safety and priority areas. Stay connected for updates and opportunities to share your views.



Investing in road safety

The safety of pedestrians and motorists across the Central Coast region is of high importance to Council with a number of initiatives and projects delivered each year in an endeavour to provide a safe environment for residents and the wider community. The Local Traffic Committee plays a key role in this process.

Recent safety improvements have been made at priority areas, such as Tuggerah Lakes Secondary College, The Entrance, Niagara Park Public School and the high pedestrian activity areas in Terrigal.




2025-26 Capital Works Program

Every year, we invest millions of dollars into a range of Capital Works Projects – delivering infrastructure that supports our growing community.

This includes upgrading sewer pump stations and treatment plants, refurbishment of water reservoirs, road construction, renewing drainage, footpaths, improving sporting grounds, public toilets, boat ramps, playspaces and other community facilities.



Our Waste Management Facilities are now cashless

From 1 July, our Buttonderry and Woy Woy Waste Management facilities stopped accepting cash – which only 5% of residents currently use – to reduce wait times and operational costs.
